Statement	Order
Undo the girth from the left side and gently release it down. Do not just let go because it may swing, hitting the horse's legs.	
Lift the saddle up slightly before pulling it towards you so it doesn't drag across the horse's back.	
Ensure the horse is securely tied up in a safe area using a quick release knot.	
Walk under the horse's neck and round to his right side, lift the girth (still attached) up and lay it over the saddle.	
Place the saddle in a safe location and brush the horses back off with a body brush. You may need to use a sponge and water to wash any sweat patches off.
